Spring Show Chairperson Cathy Szumlinski announced that we have a need for several chair people to help out and

to please see her to volunteer.

Also there is a sign-up sheet for those interested in purchasing art aprons.

Kathleen Rodak, Exhibit Co-ordinator, said she has extra entry forms at the table and asked that we do NOT cut the forms up, instead, send in the whole sheet.

The deadline for all entry forms is March 15th.

Mary Kehoe mentioned she has entry forms for the unframed.

Carl Mayer, Hanging Chair, needs a Co-Chair and briefly described the responsibilities. He also mentioned that the juror is Jeoffrey Merrill who has juried our show in the past. This juror is a non-representative abstract artist.

All paintings are to be brought to Shannon Hall at the Costick Center on Monday, March 24rth from 6:15 to 7:00p.m. to be juried, then picked up from 9 - 9:30p.m.. Wednesday, April 30th, between 4:30 and 5:30p.m. is the time-frame for all accepted art and open entries to be brought to Shannon Hall at the Costick Center. We need people to help set up panels for the show at 2p.m. that day.

Saturday, May 3rd, is check out and take down day; the time-frame being between 4:15 - 4:45p.m.

There was a vote taken to determine whether 2, or 3, attended meetings were in order to qualify for the Spring Art Show due to last month's meeting having been canceled. The majority had voted for 2 meetings this year.

The 50/50 raffle turned up 1 lucky winner who received \$20.50 (total: \$41.00).

Dean Rogers shared his illustration on the cover of "CP Treasures" magazine with the audience.

A motion to adjourn the meeting by Janet Hall and seconded by Kathleen Rodak took us to 7:17p.m.
