Foundation exists to stimulate an active interest in the creative arts through lectures, workshops, demonstrations, critiques, outdoor painting and exhibits that bring art to the community.

A popular program is the Senior Painters group that meets weekly at the Costick Center. Paints and materials are provided by the organization and the seniors display their work in the Spring Festival of the

Arts exhibit.

Another important program is called Art Smart. There are 15 grade schools that receive over 500 art prints of famous work coordinated by the Farmington Art Foundation. The schools provide volunteers to take the prints into the classrooms to expose children to prominent works of art.
